### **Q: Is Carlos Albizu University accredited?**

**A:** The B.S. Psychology program at Carlos Albizu University (CAU) has enjoyed the accreditation of the Middle States Commission for Higher Education since its inception.

### **Q: Is the program accredited by the American Psychological Association (APA)?**

**A:** The APA does not provide accreditation for undergraduate programs. However, the B.S. Psychology Program at CAU is designed to meet or exceed the recommendations of the APA for undergraduate psychology programs.

**Q: Will I be eligible for financial aid while attending CAU?**

**A:** Eligibility for financial aid is determined on an individual basis following government and lender guidelines. Students seeking financial aid should consult with a financial aid officer to determine their eligibility.

**Q: May I transfer credits from previously attended institutions toward my undergraduate degree, and if so, how many?**

**A:** Yes, depending on the type of institution previously attended. Students are allowed to transfer up to ninety (90) credits from other four-year universities and up to sixty (60) credits from two year colleges. A transfer of credit application may be obtained from the Admissions Department. It should be kept in mind that credits submitted for transfer are evaluated by the department of undergraduate psychology, and transfers are awarded based on the relevance of each subject area to their CAU curriculum.
